

## Finishing Instructions for Interior Wood Doors by Harris Door and Millwork

## **Preparation**

- 1. Lay It Flat: Start by removing the door from its frame and placing it on a flat, clean surface.
- 2. **Smooth It Out**: Gently sand the entire door with #180 grit sandpaper, especially if it has heavy veneers. Always sand in the direction of the grain to avoid scratches.
- 3. **Clean It Up**: Before you start finishing, ensure all dust is removed from the door. We recommend using a tack cloth for this purpose. Just be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- 4. **No Air Blowing**: Avoid using compressed air to remove dust, as the moisture can cause water spots on stained finishes.

## **Painting Your Door**

- 1. **Primer Selection**: Choose a high-quality oil-based pigmented primer. Avoid water-based finishes, as they can cause grain raising.
- 2. **Water-Based Products Warning**: Do not use water-based primers or paints. They can adversely affect the wood, and their use will void all warranties.
- 3. Exterior Door Paint: If you're painting an exterior door, make sure to use exterior grade paint.
- 4. **Full Coverage**: Ensure all surfaces of the door, including the top and bottom, are evenly covered with paint.
- 5. **Top Coat Times Two**: Apply at least two top coats, sanding between each coat. For glazed doors, overlap the top coat onto the glass by about 1/16" to protect it from moisture.
- 6. **Sunlight Precaution**: Avoid using black or dark-colored top coats on doors that will be exposed to direct sunlight for extended periods.

## **Staining Your Door**

- 1. **Start with Oil**: Begin by applying an oil-based prestain or conditioner. Using a wood conditioner is imperative for achieving an even finish, as it helps prevent blotchiness and allows for more uniform stain absorption.
- 2. **Water-Based Stain Warning**: Refrain from using water-based stains, as they can lead to veneer peeling and are not covered under warranty.
- 3. **Staining Steps**: Apply an oil-based semitransparent stain or clear undercoat. Follow with three coats of clear top coat varnish or polyurethane, sanding lightly between coats. For exterior doors, use products with UV inhibitors.
- 4. **Protecting Glazed Doors**: If your door is glazed, overlap the top coat onto the glass to shield it from moisture.
